

# The Heart of Dr. Bob's Home Paul G.

Sometimes, during the frequent responsibilities we attend to, I remember our real purpose here at Dr. Bob's Home in Akron, Ohio - where Dr. Bob Smith and Bill Wilson first met in 1935 - is to ensure it stands as both a living remembrance and a lighthouse for recovery. More than just a preserved residence, it is a bright thread in the fabric of Alcoholics Anonymous and the wider recovery community. AA members, students, clinicians and historians come not only to see the rooms where the seeds of AA began, but to grasp how an idea born around a kitchen table grew into a worldwide fellowship. The home anchors a narrative that blends history with hope: the story of two people who discovered that one alcoholic helping another could change countless lives.

That impact is multiplied daily by our volunteers who keep the doors open, the archives organized, and the story accessible. Docents guide our daily visitors, along with those from medical schools and treatment programs, with care; researchers safeguard letters, books, and artifacts; and event coordinators host talks, workshops and educational tours for various groups.

Through its Ambassador Program, supporters extend the message beyond Akron—sharing presentations with a national exposure; welcoming virtual audiences; and building partnerships that carry the lessons of service and spiritual growth into communities that might never set foot on our Founders' Path.

As new initiatives take root—digitizing collections, expanding written materials and cultivating an atmosphere that welcomes exciting additional programming - the home continues to evolve without losing simplicity at its core. It is a place where history breathes, service is practiced and outreach invites the next person in need to hear that recovery is possible. In honoring the miracle that occurred here when Bill met Bob, the community around Dr. Bob's Home keeps that miracle in motion - one visitor, one volunteer, one quiet act of service at a time.

# Finding Light in the Darkness: My Journey at Dr. Bob's Home

I still remember the first time I walked through the doors of Dr. Bob's Home. I was 30 days sober—fragile, hurting, confused and completely lost. My heart felt heavy, my mind chaotic, and I didn't know if I could trust myself to make it another day.

And then I felt it. The warmth. The acceptance. The people who volunteered there wrapped me in arms I didn't know I deserved. They took me under their wing, held me up when I couldn't hold myself, and quietly, gently, gave me hope. They showed me light when all I could see was darkness.

Over the past year and a half, I've had the privilege of welcoming guests through those same doors. People carrying their own pain, their own struggles, yet carrying something else, too: resilience, courage and belief in themselves. Watching them show up for their recovery reminded me what's possible. It showed me that hope isn't just a word - it's alive. It's breathing. And it can touch you, change you, if you let it.



Volunteering at Dr. Bob's Home has been transformational. It forced me to step out of myself, to give when I felt empty, and to show up even when I felt weak. My sponsor suggested I do it. I wasn't sure I could. But today, I know this: service heals. Service gives. Service saves. And the act of helping someone else is often the very thing that saves you.

If you are looking for healing, looking for hope, looking for light—show up. Step out. Give back. Because when you do, you don't just change someone else's life—you change your own.

Our team recently completed the installation of a new furnace at Dr. Bob's Home, ensuring reliable and efficient heating for the upcoming winter months. As part of this project, we also upgraded the air filtration system to a modern 4-inch filter, improving indoor air quality and helping to better preserve this historic home for future generations.

In addition to these upgrades, routine maintenance and cleaning have

been performed across all three of our properties. Regular upkeep and attention to detail ensure that each location remains safe, welcoming and well-presented for our visitors, volunteers and staff. Our primary purpose is to maintain, restore and preserve the property at 855 Ardmore Avenue, which was the family home of physician Robert Holbrook Smith, affectionately called Dr. Bob, one of the founding fathers of Alcoholics Anonymous. This historic site in Akron, Ohio is the birth place of this internationally known fellowship, which subsequently became the foundation of numerous 12-step programs that are improving the lives of millions.

Second, our ongoing mission is to help alcoholics by preserving the atmosphere of acceptance where early members achieved and maintained their sobriety. This prevailing attitude is simply expressed in our greeting, "Welcome Home."

Third, we educate the local community and beyond on how Dr. Bob's Home played a part in the formation of Alcoholics Anonymous and the manner in which alcoholics were helped in the early days.
